The NCC recruits cadets from schools and colleges across India, providing them with basic military training in small arms and drills.

The NCC emblem consists of three colours: Red, Dark Blue, and Light Blue, representing the Indian Army, Indian Navy, and Indian Air Force, respectively. The 17 lotuses symbolize the 17 directorates of India.

The NCC unit at Sree Narayana College, Nattika, falls under the 24[K] BN NCC Thrissur, Ernakulam Group HQ, Kerala and Lakshadweep Directorate.

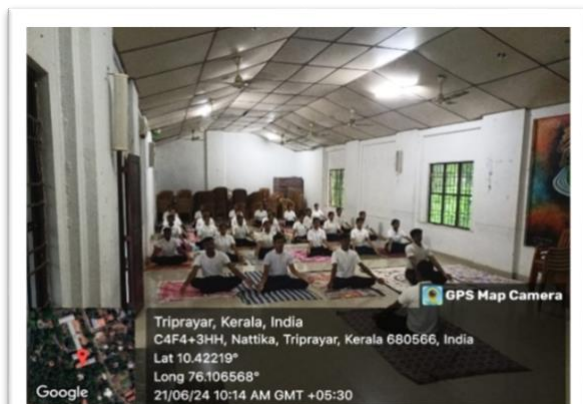
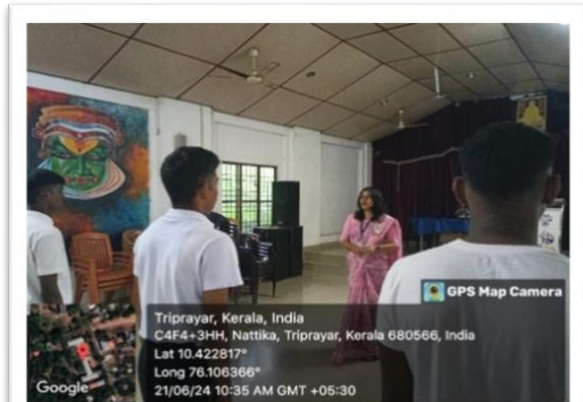
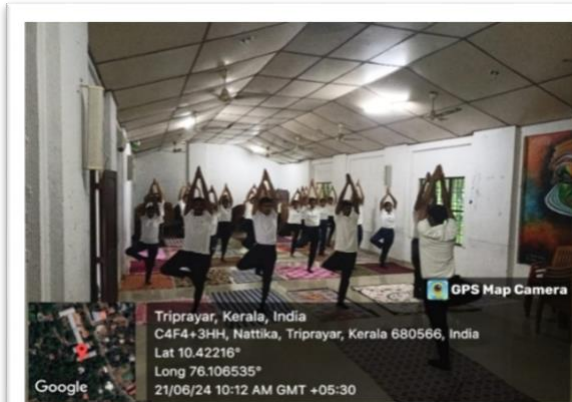




YOGA DAY

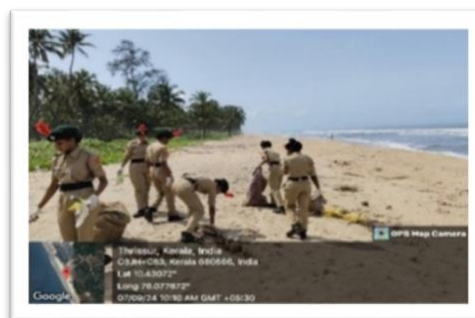

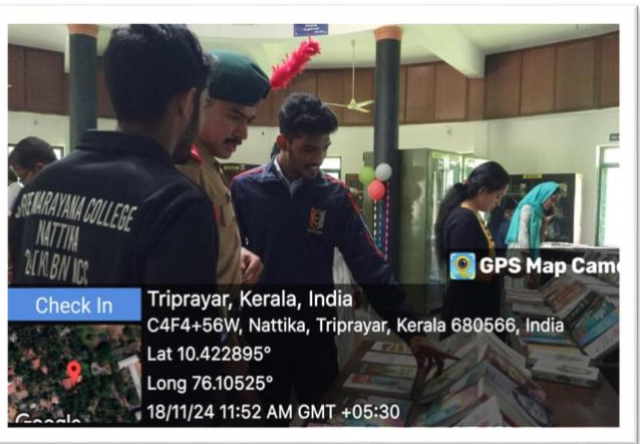


BOOK FAIR 2024

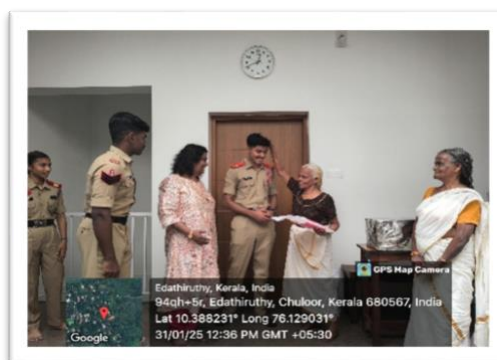
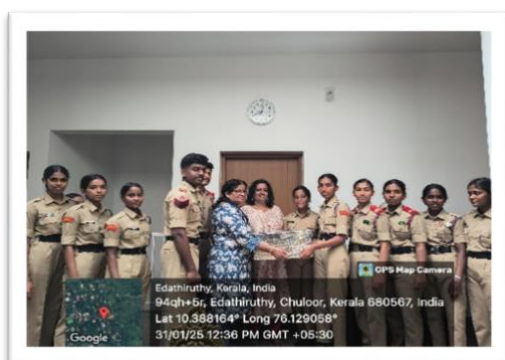

Through their active participation, the NCC cadets demonstrated their commitment to community service and environmental sustainability, aligning with the broader objectives of the State's Zero Waste initiative.

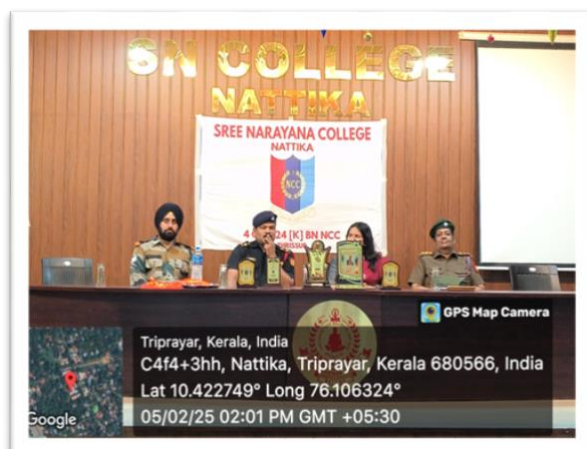


AO LT.COL. BRIJESH M T, 24 [K] BN VISITS **SREE NARAYANA COLLEGE NATTIKA**

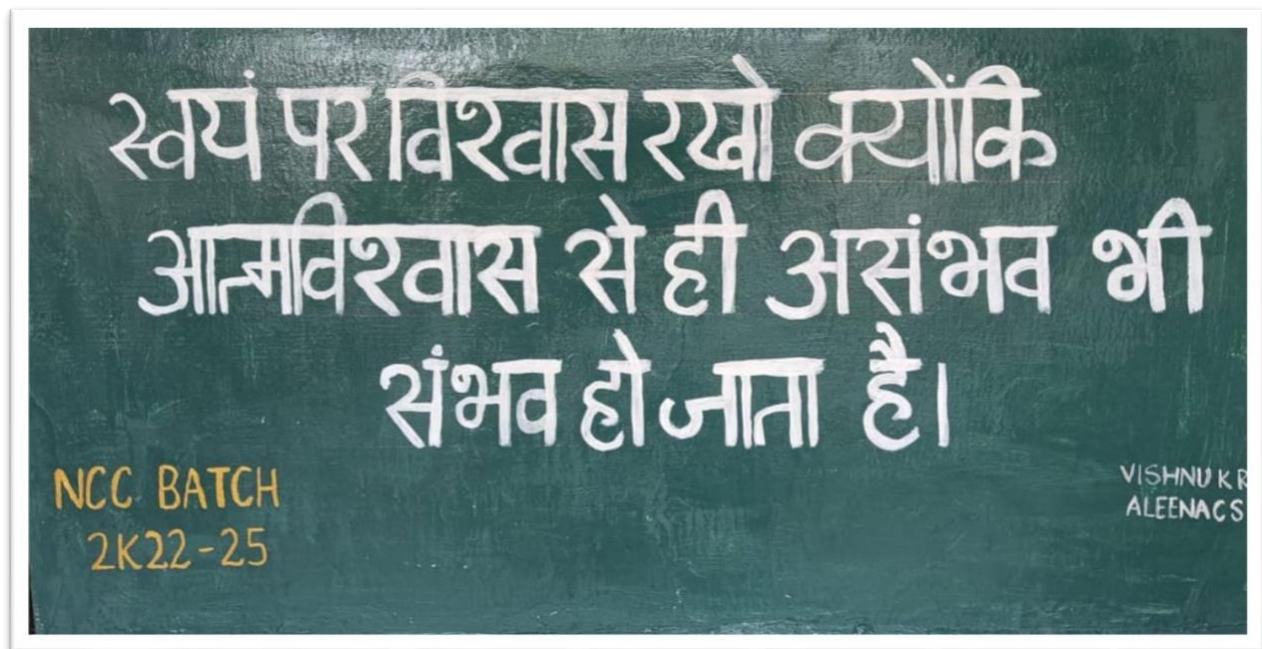

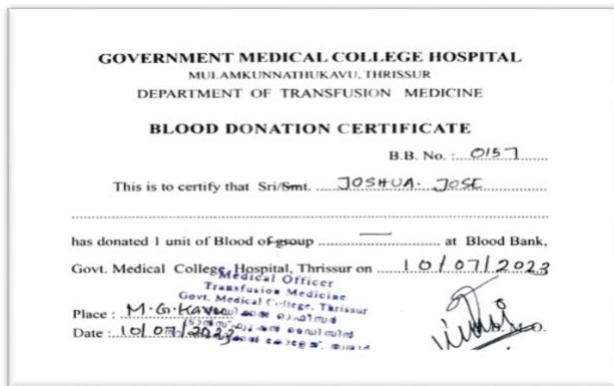
CERTIFICATES
