

### 5. The College Arts Festival

The College Union Arts Festival was conducted on January 8, 9, and 14, 2025. The competitions for off-stage items were held on January 8th and 9th, 2025, and the on-stage items were held on January 14, 2025.

On January 8, 2025, union officials were assigned duties in three groups. Stage 1 hosted competitions in Malayalam essay, English essay, Tamil essay, English short story, and embroidery. Stage 2 became the venue for Arabic essay, Sanskrit essay, Malayalam short story, Sanskrit, Urdu, Tamil short story and rangoli competitions. Stage 3 held Hindi essay, Urdu essay, Arabic short story, collage, and cartoon competitions. The events began at 10:00 AM and concluded at 4:30 PM. The first day of the Arts Fest ended on a grand note.

The second day of the arts festival was equally successful, with various competitions and events taking place. The union officials were divided into three groups and assigned duties. On the second day, various competitions were organized at three different venues (stages). Events began at 10:00 AM and concluded at 4:00 PM. Stage 2, held in the Physics Class, featured competitions in watercolor, oil painting, pencil drawing, and quiz. Stage 3, in the Banquet Hall, hosted Malayalam versification, Urdu/Sanskrit/Tamil versification, Hindi versification, poster making, and Malayalam/Hindi/Sanskrit recitation competitions. Stage 4, in the Visitors' Lounge, witnessed competitions in Arabic versification, English versification, English recitation, Malayalam speech, and English speech. Day 2 ended on a positive note.

When the results of the two-day competition were announced, the joint team of the Departments of Economics, Botany, and B Voc emerged in the leading positions with 120 points.

On the third day of Kalothsavam (January 14, 2025), the on-stage events commenced with an inauguration ceremony at 9:30 AM. The competitions commenced at 10:30 AM, featuring various events such as Mohiniyattam, Kuchipudi, Bharatanatyam, Naadan Paattu, Kerala Nadanam, group dance, Oppana, skit, mime, Thiruvathira, Vattapaattu, Mappilapaattu, classical music, Karnatic music, light music, mimicry, mono act, Deshabhakthi Ganam, Sangha Ganam, and Vanchipaatu. Participating students reported to the registration office, collected their chest numbers, and performed for the competitions. Winners were announced at the end of each event.

The overall scores for the three-day event were announced at 5:30 PM. The Economics, Botany, and B.Voc departments emerged as the winners with 149 marks, followed closely by the Malayalam, Statistics, and Mathematics departments. After announcing the results, Principal Dr. Jaya P. S. distributed the prizes. The program, which began at 9:30 AM, concluded at 5:30 PM, marking the end of a successful competition. The three-day event

concluded successfully, with all activities being conducted in a highly organized and efficient manner.
