

Sree Narayana College, Nattika, Thrissur

A Brief Account

Inspired by Sree Narayana Guru's call to "Seek freedom and enlightenment through education", a few distinguished citizens of Nattika, felt the need to start a college in this backward area. They sought the guidance of Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam. A meeting presided over by the Late Sri. R. Sankar, held at Ayyanthole, Thrissur, on 15th October 1965 took the decision to establish the college. Consequently, Nattika Sree Narayana College Local Committee was constituted which elected the Late Sri. T. R. Raghavan as President and the Late Adv. N. K. Kuttiraman as Secretary.

The committee proceeded with the endeavour to collect funds, acquire land and property and set up a building for the college. Messrs Elite Fabrics, Thrissur contributed the land worth more than Rs. 1 Lakh. The committee succeeded in collecting the requisite funds within a remarkably short period. The foundation stone of the building was laid by the Late Sri. R. Sankar in the presence of a large, distinguished gathering on 10th April 1966. The building was completed within the time-limit and affiliation was secured from the University of Kerala. The college was formally inaugurated by the Late Sri. K. Ayyappan (Sahodaran) on 30th June 1967. The college was affiliated to the newly constituted University of Calicut in July 1969.

The college attained the status of a first grade college in Kerala in June 1970 with the commencement of Degree courses in Economics, Commerce, Botany and Zoology. B. Sc. Physics was started in 1978, M. Com in 1979 and B. Sc. Mathematics in 1981. The South-Block was constructed in 1982. B.Sc. Chemistry and M. Sc. Zoology was started in 1983 and M.Sc. Mathematics in 1984. The construction of the North Block was completed in 1992 and the building was inaugurated by the Late Sri. M.K.Raghavan, the then General Secretary of S. N. Trusts.

The college celebrated its Silver Jubilee during the academic year 1993-1994, marking a significant milestone in its history. The same year saw the introduction of the B.A. Malayalam program. The institution continued its upward trajectory with the launch of the M.A. Economics program in 1995, followed by M.Sc. Physics in 1998, M.Sc. Botany in



1999, and M.Sc. Applied Chemistry in 2001. Further advancements were made with the introduction of M.Sc. Statistics and the B.Voc program in Food Technology in 2021, reinforcing the college's commitment to academic excellence and diversification of disciplines.

In obeisance to our Patron Saint Sree Narayana Guru, a Gurumandapam was constructed in front of the college by the management and well-wishers to mark the Golden Jubilee year of the college during 2017-18. A spacious two storey library was also constructed during this year with the generous funding from prestigious alumni members to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of their alma mater.

The assessment and accreditation by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) rated the college at B Grade in the 2nd cycle in 2014 and re-accredited it in the 3rd cycle with B⁺ grade in 2021. The college received DST-FIST fund for development of infrastructure in Science departments in 2015. Another significant achievement secured by the college is a position in the 150-200 rank band of National Institute Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2019, 2020 and 2021. In the current academic year 2025-2026, the college is receiving DBT-STAR, RUSA fund for infrastructure development in science. The college looks forward to scale better heights in the years to come.




Inspired by the Guru's vision to "Seek Freedom and Enlightenment through Education", a few distinguished citizens of Nattika felt the need to start a college in this backward coastal area. Under the guidance of Sri R.Sankar, the founder Secretary of Sree Narayana Trusts, a college development committee was constituted with Sri.T.R.Raghavan as President, Adv. N.K.Kuttiraman as Secretary and Sri.K.S.Chathunny as Treasurer.

The foundation stone of the building was laid by Sri.R.Sankar on 10th April 1966. The college, affiliated to the University of Kerala was formally inaugurated by Sahodaran K. Ayyappan on 30th June 1967. It was in July 1969 that the college was affiliated to the newly constituted University of Calicut.



Management of the College

The Management of the college is vested with the Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam one of the leading educational agencies in the Kerala State. The Secretary of the Trusts is the Manager of the college. Courses Offered

Sree Narayana College, Nattika offers a wide range of academic programs under the University of Calicut. As the University of Calicut has introduced Four-Year Undergraduate Programs (FYUGP) starting from the academic year 2024-25, the existing regular undergraduate programs will be gradually phased out following the completion of the current batch.

UG Programme Structure

The duration of a UG programme shall be 6 semesters distributed over a period of 3 academic years. The odd semesters (1, 3, and 5) shall be from June to October and the even semesters (2, 4, and 6) shall be from November to March. The UG programme shall include five types of courses

Common Courses (Code A)

Two English courses and one additional language course (chosen by the student -Malayalam/ Hindi/ Sanskrit) during the Semester I (A01, A02, A07) and Semester II (A03, A04, A08) while only one English course and one additional language course during the Semester III (A05, A09) and Semester IV (A06, A10) for B.A. & B.Sc. Programmes whereas for B.Com. Programme, two English courses and one additional language course during the Semester I and Semester II as in the case of B.A and B.Sc. Programme while no language course during the Semester III and Semester IV.

Core Courses (Code B)

Core courses are the courses in the major subject of the degree programme chosen by the student. Core courses are offered by the parent department.



Complementary Courses (Code C)

Complementary courses cover one or two disciplines that are related to the core subject and are distributed in the first four semesters.

Open Courses (Code D)

There shall be one open course in core subjects in the fifth semester. The open course shall be open to all the students in the institution except the students in the parent department. The students can opt that course from any other department in the institution. Each department can decide the open course from a pool of three courses offered by the University. Total credit allotted for open course is 3 and the hours allotted is 3.

Ability Enhancement Courses / Audit Courses (Code E)

Audit courses are mandatory for a programme but not counted for the calculation of SGPA or CGPA. There shall be one Audit course each in the first four semesters. These courses are not meant for class room study. The students can attain only pass (Grade P) for these courses. At the end of each semester there shall be examination conducted by the college from a pool of questions (Question Bank) set by the University. The students can also attain these credits through online courses like SWAYAM, MOOC etc. (optional).

Grace Marks

Grace marks may be awarded to a student for meritorious achievements in co-curricular activities (in Sports/Arts/NSS/NCC/ Student Entrepreneurship) carried out besides the regular hours. Such a benefit is applicable and limited to a maximum of 8 courses in an academic year spreading over two semesters. In addition, maximum of 6 marks per semester can be awarded to the students of UG Programmes, for participating in the College Fitness Education Programme (COFE).

Extra Credit

Extra credit may be awarded to a student for achievements in co-curricular activities carried out outside the regular class hours. This credit shall not be counted while considering the minimum credit (120) for passing the programme. The details are given below:

Course Evaluation

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts:

- 1) External Evaluation: 80% of the total marks in each course are from the external examinations
- 2) Internal assessment: 20% marks are from the internal examinations

Moderation

Moderation is eligible as per the existing rules of the Academic Council.



Revaluation

In the new system of grading, revaluation is permissible. The prevailing rules of revaluation are applicable to CBCSSUG 2020. Students can apply for photocopies of answer scripts of external examinations. Applications for photocopies/scrutiny/revaluation should be submitted within 10 days of publication of results. The fee for this shall be as decided by the University.

Improvement

Improvement of a particular semester can be done only once. The student shall avail of the improvement chance in the succeeding year after the successful completion of the semester concerned. The students can improve a maximum of two courses in a particular semester. The internal marks already obtained will be carried forward to determine the new grade/mark in the improvement examination for regular students. If the candidate fails to appear for the improvement examination after registration, or if there is no change in the results of the improved examination, the mark/grade obtained in the first appearance will be retained. Improvement and supplementary examinations cannot be done simultaneously.

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COLLEGE BYE-LAWS

Admission and Withdrawal

- I. Students are usually admitted only at the beginning of the first year of the Degree and Post Graduate Courses.
- II. Candidates who have passed the +2 or equivalent examinations, with eligibility for admission to a course of study in the University are admitted to the Degree Course
- III. Candidates who have passed the respective Degree examinations namely B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. are admitted to the respective Post Graduate Courses. However 10% of the M.A. Economics seats are reserved for candidates who have passed the B.Sc., Mathematics Degree Course.
- IV. Sree Narayana College, Nattika is affiliated to the University of Calicut. Admission to all the courses, both UG and PG, are done through the Common Admission Programme of University of Calicut known as Single Window System (SWS) for admission in UG and PG Programmes. The students who seek admission to the programmes offered by our college should apply online through the University website - www.universityofcalicut.info or www.cuonline.ac.in

A Nodal Centre is functioning at Sree Narayana College, Nattika in connection with the admission to provide a helping hand to the students and the University. The students can do registration, editing, re-arrangement of option, cancellation of higher option etc through the Nodal Centres. The students can also utilise the Nodal Centres for clearing their doubts and clarification regarding the Centralised Admission process (CAP).

The students should produce the following documents at the time of interview.

1. Original Mark list, 2. Transfer Certificate 3. Conduct Certificate

Candidates possessing qualifying certificates from Universities other than the University of Calicut or Board of Examination other than that of Kerala shall also produce:

- a. Migration Certificate
- b. Qualifying Certificate
- c. Eligibility Certificate from the University of Calicut.



- V. No Candidate shall be enrolled to attend any classes until the prescribed fees are paid in full.
- VI. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed and will forfeit whatever fees he / she has paid.
- VII. A student applying for Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate etc. should have paid all fees and dues, if any. Medical inspection will be conducted and Conduct Certificates will be normally issued, free of charge, within three months of completion of course of study at the college. Late application for T.C. must be accompanied by a fine of Rs. 100/-
A fee of Rs. 50/- will be levied for the issue of duplicate T.C. However, it will be issued only on the basis of a Certificate from a First Class Magistrate to the effect that the original is lost irrecoverably.
- VIII. Immediately after the interview, the candidate, if selected, will be provisionally enrolled on payment of the first installment of fees and the submission of the certificates.
- IX. Caution Deposit will be refunded only at the end of the course after clearing the dues, if any.

Residence, Dress and Discipline of students

1. Students who do not live with their parents or guardian should reside only in hostels and lodges approved by the Principal.
2. Every student is expected to be decent, cultured, polished and pleasing in their words and deeds inside and outside the college.
3. College uniform is compulsory for all UG and PG admissions from 2016 onwards. Uniform for girls: Modestly stitched Salwar and Kurta (without slit) with a black overcoat in the prescribed uniform material. Uniform for boys: Half sleeve shirt and pants in the prescribed uniform material. Colour dress is permitted on Wednesday. Students are required to be neat and tidy in dress and person. They are advised to be courteous.
4. Students should handle college property with care. They are also expected to do whatever they can to promote the beauty, charm and dignity of the campus.
5. Students should not write, carve or paint anything on any part of the college building, walls, furniture etc.



6. No meeting or function of any kind shall be held in the campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
7. Students are not allowed to stand or roam about in the verandas and corridors or do anything which might disturb the classes during working hours.
8. Student's discipline is subjected to the judgement of Hon. High Court of Kerala WA No. 535/2003 dated 26-05-2003.
9. Smoking, chewing, snuffing and other unwholesome practices are strictly prohibited.
10. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, indifference in class, habitual mischief-making, obscenity in deed or words are sufficient reasons for suspension or dismissal of a student from the college. Minor offences are punishable with fine.
11. Malpractice in examinations and test papers will be severely dealt with.
12. Any genuine grievance of students may be brought to the notice of the Principal either directly or through the Group Tutor.
13. The Principal is the final authority in the interpretation of the college bye-laws and he/she reserves the right to frame and enforce rules governing the conduct of students in the class rooms and in the campus.
14. Students are not permitted to use mobile phones inside the campus as per the government order. A fine will be imposed on those students who violate the rule. The use of all kinds of cameras, including mobile phone cameras, is strictly prohibited in the campus

Warning against Ragging

Ragging is a criminal offence and is strictly prohibited in the campus.

Ragging is any disorderly conduct, words spoken or written or by any act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any junior student, indulging in rowdy and indisciplined activities to a student of an educational institution which causes are likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear of shame or embarrassment to that student. It also includes asking a student to do any act or perform something which the student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.



If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student will be given an opportunity to explain and if the explanation is not found satisfactory, the student will be expelled from the institution.

Any written complaint obtained regarding ragging will also be forwarded to the police authorities. College will not be responsible for the criminal proceedings initiated in this regard.

Morning Prayer

Before the commencement of classes in the morning, the recorded 'Daiva Dasakam' sung by the former student of the college is played through the public address system. Staff and students should observe silence during the prayer.

Identity Cards

Every student who joins the college will be provided with an Identity Card attached to a string. Students shall wear this card around their neck while they are in the campus and show the same when demanded by the authorities. Those who refuse to obey this rule will face disciplinary actions.

Excursions, Picnics and Study Tours

Students are not permitted to organise or conduct excursions or picnics without the knowledge and consent of the class teacher and department heads. Study tours will be organised by the respective departments. Only final year students will be permitted to go on excursion and tours. Written consent in the prescribed form should be obtained from the guardians of all students going on excursion. A detailed programme of travel, stay, places of visit, names of participants etc. should be submitted to the Principal before proceeding on a tour/excursion. No student from another class will be permitted to join a class going on excursion. There should be a minimum of two teachers (one male and one female) to accompany each team. Excursions, Picnics and Tours will be allowed only during the third term of the academic year.

Proceedings of the Manager & Principal

In addition to the existing Rules and Regulations, the following set of rules are incorporated in the Rules and Regulations of the college with effect from 01-06-2015



All political and organizational activities are strictly prohibited in the campus. Student organizations are not recognized by the college authorities and are banned inside the campus. Their requests or demands shall not be entertained. However, those organizations that are complementary to the academic pursuits can be permitted by the Principal.

Nobody shall disrupt the academic atmosphere of the college under any circumstance. Any such activities that may hamper the academic ambience of the institution will be seriously dealt with. Such misconduct would entail major punishment including expulsion from the college. If necessary, criminal prosecution will also be invoked.

Destruction of college property would entail civil as well as criminal proceedings. Delinquents will be held liable to pay compensation for the loss.

Nobody shall instigate or engage in activities such as strike, demonstration, agitation, slogan shouting, etc. within the college campus.

College Union Election will be conducted only under indirect mode/ Parliamentary System. No external or political interference shall be permitted. Outsiders shall not enter the college campus without the permission of the college authorities.

Smoking, chewing gum, use of tobacco, pan-parag, drugs, liquor and all products that are either banned, illicit or injurious to health are strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Nobody shall enter the college campus after consuming liquor/drugs or under intoxication.

Use of Cell Phones/Mobile Phones is prohibited inside the college campus. Cell Phone with camera are banned inside the college campus by the State Government. In the event of any violation of the above rule, action will be taken including confiscation of the device and imposition of fine.

All legal and reasonable grievances of the students will be addressed by the college authorities. In the event of any such grievance, the aggrieved can approach the respective Class Tutor or the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee existing in the college. The decision of the Principal shall be final.

Teachers are directed to insist on strict compliance of the Rules and Regulations mentioned above. Violations, if any, shall be reported to the Principal immediately.



Attendance

1. There are five working days in a week.
2. Every working day will have two sessions. The morning session is from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and the afternoon session from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. The morning session is divided into 3 periods and the afternoon session into 2 periods, each of one hour duration. Besides lecture classes there will be seminars, group discussions, tutorials, and counseling
3. Absence for any one period will be treated as absence for half a day, absence during any one period in both halves will be treated as absence for one full day.
4. Students should be in their seats right from the beginning of each class. They should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher. Late comers shall not enter the class without the permission of the teacher. No student shall loiter in the campus or veranda during class hours.
5. Leave of absence for a period or a portion of it may be obtained from the teacher concerned. Leave for a day or more shall be obtained in advance from the Principal on written application in the prescribed form through the Head of the Dept. The Principal reserves the right to reject or grant leave
6. Unauthorized absence for 10 working days or more at a stretch is sufficient ground for removal of a student from the roll.
7. The minimum requirement of attendance during a semester shall be 75% for each course. Attendance shall be maintained by the concerned course teacher. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 9 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a degree programme may be granted by the university. Benefits of attendance may be given to students who attend university union activities, meeting of university bodies and participation in extracurricular activities by treating as present for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation/attendance certificate in such activities issued by the university authorities/Principals (subject to a maximum of 9 days in a semester)
8. A minimum attendance of 75% of the total working days of the year is required for promotion and for admission to University examination. Deficiency will be condoned only if the Syndicate is satisfied with the reason for the leave. Deficiency beyond 20



days will not be condoned on any account. Exemption will not be granted for more than one academic year in a course of study.

9. No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was caused by reasons beyond the control of the student and that leave was duly applied for during the period of absence.

Registration

1. A student shall be permitted to register for the programme at the time of admission. If registration for examination is not possible owing to shortage of attendance beyond condonation limit, the student shall make up the shortage of attendance in that semester (Repeat Semester) after the completion of the programme. The repeat semester shall be possible only once in the entire programme
2. The condonation of shortage of attendance shall be granted according to the existing prescribed norms
3. A student who registers for the course shall complete the course within 6 years from the year of registration

Issue of Certificates

1. Generally 3 days' notice is required for issue of any formal certificates.
2. Certificates will be issued only after clearance of fees and dues, if any.
3. T.C. and Conduct Certificate will be issued only at the end of the course.
4. All certificates will be issued only in the afternoon of regular working days.

- I. Tuition fees will be collected at time of admission and with in a period of seven consecutive working days begining from the date of reopening of the college for senior classes . In the case of students of junior classes the same will be collected on the date of admission. Subsequent installments will be collected on or before the 7th consecutive working day of the month concerned. The Principal reserves the right to fix the due date for collection of fees for the various classes.
- II. If any student fails to pay the fees on the due date he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs.5/- along with the fees on or before the 10th day. If the due date of the 10th day happens to be a holiday,



the next working day will be counted as the 10th day. If the fine of Rs. 5/- is not paid along with the fees on the date fixed an additional fine of Rs.10/- will have to be paid. Rs. 50/- will be imposed as re-admission fees from those who fail to remit the tuition fees even after the permitted date of remittance of fees with fine.

- III. If the fees and fines of the installment are not paid on or before the last opportunity given for payment of that installment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance also from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be readmitted he/she has to apply for special permission of the Principal.

Fee Concession

- (a) Applicants belonging to the SC/ST/OBC, Kudumbis and Christian converts from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are bonafide subjects of Kerala State are eligible for full concession, stipend and lumpsum grant for purchase of books and dress. They will have to produce at the time of admission a Certificate of Nativity and Certificate of Community, if the community is not shown in the S.S.C/S.S.L.C. book.
- (b) Applicants belonging to Backward and Forward Communities who are bonafide subjects of the Kerala State are eligible for full fee concession if the annual income of their families does not exceed Rupees one lakh.
- (c) Exemption, from payment of tuition fees is granted to the Children/ Grand Children of Political Sufferer's if the income does not exceed Rs. 1,00,000 per annum.

Applicants eligible for fee concession will have to produce the following certificates at the time of admission.

1. Applicants belonging to the SC/ST, Kudumbi and Christian Converts from SC/ST should produce an income certificate and Community Certificate in original.
2. OBC students must produce an income certificate issued by the village officer and countersigned by the Local Panchayat President/Chairman of Municipality/Mayor of the Corporation/



Honorary Magistrate/M.L.A. or M.P. in the prescribed form.

3. The income of both the parents must be shown in the form and certificate of income of the guardian will be accepted only in the case of orphans or in other exceptional cases.
4. Community and Nativity Certificate in the prescribed form have to be submitted within 15 days from the commencement of class; if this has not been done, fees will have to be paid.
5. Applicants who do not produce the necessary certificates at the time of admission will not be admitted unless they pay the prescribed fees.
6. In the case of applicants whose parents died in harness while in the State Government Service, harness fees concession will be granted on production of necessary documents, provided the income of the guardian does not exceed Rs. 4000/- per annum.

Refund of Caution Deposit

1. Caution deposit levied will be refunded when the student completes his/her course of study after deduction of dues, if any. However, in the case of a student leaving the college with his/her T.C. before completion of the course of study, the caution deposit will be refunded.
2. Student applying for caution deposits shall produce the receipts issued for remittance of the deposit. Failure to do so will result in the forfeiture of the amount.
3. Claim for refund of caution deposits shall be made before the reopening of the college, after completion of a course, by the applicants. If this is not done, the names of those who have not claimed the deposits will be published on the college notice board.

Major Facilities in the College Campus

College Hostel

Sree Narayana College has a permanent separate hostel building for the accommodation of girl students in the campus. The admission to the hostel is offered to the students based on the need and academic merit of the applicants due to the limited availability of seats. Those who wish to get the hostel facility shall submit separate application



after obtaining admission in the college and need to pay the caution deposit. The mess fee and rent are to be paid monthly.

Hostel Rules:

- * Hostellers should maintain a cordial and healthy relationship with all inmates.
- * Students shall have to abide by the decisions of the hostel wardens with respect to enforcement of the hostel rules failing which strict disciplinary action will be taken.
- * Students are responsible for the custody of all their belongings including cash and valuables and the college will not be responsible for any loss incurred due to negligence or any other reason whatsoever.
- * The hostel wardens have full authority to check any room in the hostel at any time.
- * Consumption of alcoholic drinks, smoking and using other intoxicants and drugs in the hostel and its premises are strictly prohibited.
- * Hostellers desiring to go out other than to college shall obtain permission from the warden concerned before going out and register whereabouts in the movement register.
- * Students shall not remain absent from their hostels during the night between 8.00 P.M. to 8.00 A.M. without prior permission of the warden.
- * No hosteller may remain in the hostel during class hours unless ill and only with permission from the warden.
- * All cases of illness must be reported immediately to the warden who will arrange for medical aid
- * Students who absent themselves from the hostel without prior sanction for more than 14 days will be struck off from the rolls.
- * Hostel will remain closed during the vacation.
- * Visitors are allowed only after class hours and allowed to visit the hosteller in the visitor's room only up to 6pm.
- * Written permission of the parents/guardian is necessary to visit houses of relatives and friends.
- * No permission to stick pictures, posters or notices on the bathrooms, lavatories, furniture, walls etc.
- * Students violating any of the hostel rules will be issued a warning. A third warning will result in the student being dismissed from the hostel.

COMMITTEES FOR STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

Anti Ragging Cell

The College has a vigilant committee against instances of ragging. The Committee takes measures to repeatedly remind students of the consequences of ragging, and ensures that parents and new students are made aware of their rights. Anti-Ragging Committee is constituted in this college to prevent ragging and to take anti-ragging measures as per the guide lines issued by the Supreme Court of India and UGC.



The Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1998* (Act 10 of 1998)

An Act to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Kerala

Preamble. - WHEREAS it is expedient to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Kerala.

BE it enacted in the Forty-Ninth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title, extent and Commencement. (1) This Act may be called the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1998.(2) It extends the whole of the State of Kerala.(3) It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 23rd day of October, 1997.

Definition

In this Act, unless the context otherwise required,-(a) 'head of the educational institution' means the Principal or the Headmaster or the person responsible for the management of that educational institution;(b) 'Ragging' means doing of any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes-(i) teasing, abusing or paying practical jokes on, or causing hurt to, such student; or(ii) asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course willingly, do.

Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging within or without any educational institution is prohibited.

Penalty for Ragging

Whoever commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within, or without, any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

Dismissal of Student

Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such dismissal.



Suspension of Student

- (1) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parents or guardian, or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of that educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately, forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situate, for further action.
- (2) Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is proved that there is no substance prima facie in the complaint received under sub-section (1), he shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant.

Deemed Abetment

If the head of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action in the manner specified in section 6 when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence of ragging and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section 4.

Power to Make Rules

- (1) The Government may, by notification in the Gazette, make rules for carrying out all or any of the purposes of this Act.
- (2) Every rule made under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before the Legislative Assembly, while it is in session for a total period of fourteen days, which may be comprised in one session or in two successive sessions, and if before the expiry of the session in which it is so laid, or the session immediately following, the Legislative Assembly makes any modification in the rule or decides that the rule should not be made, the rule shall, thereafter, have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be, so, however that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

Repeal and Saving

- (1) The Kerala prohibition of Ragging Ordinance, 1998 (2 of 1998) is hereby repealed.



- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or deemed to have been done or any action taken or deemed to have been taken under the said Ordinance shall be deemed to have been done or taken under this Act.
